- **Agenda- Discussion/vote on the purchase of a solar speed limit sign/signs for the City of Crouch**

Stephen Miller, new City Planner, spoke to the Mayor today. We may have a grant opportunity for our speed limit sign, from the US DOT. If we do qualify the deadline to apply is 11/18/2022. Mayor will nail down the process with Mr. Miller. Member CS went over the description of the signs. He had a zoom meeting with personal at Radarsigns. This is a very sturdy sign and they do require some maintenance. Possibly put a little farther off the road to avoid the snows. Member SM suggested maybe we wait until February, after the Winter. Comment from the audience: Would it be possible to place the signs a little closer in town? Drivers may pay more attention to them. That could be possible. Geoff is still working on getting with BCS to see about getting more police presence in Crouch. Idea was brought up about attaching the signs to the power poles. Would be a very sturdy pole. The signs do come with poles and they do have them in stock. Another suggestion was to use 6X6 poles instead of 4X4's not aluminum ones. Member LA read some of the grant information to Council. Council could give the Mayor authority to purchase the signs if necessary. Mayor said he will have more information by our November 9<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting. Member CS made the Motion (funding pending) to approve the Radarsigns with posts, when Council does decide what to do. Member SM second the Motion. Roll call-SM-Y, CS-Y, LA-Y. If we can obtain a grant, two maybe three signs could be purchased. All depends on grant funding. If no funding is obtainable, LOT funds would be used to purchase the signs. Question was asked: Does the City receive 90% of speeding ticket money? Can the City raise the fine on a speeding ticket? Normally the money goes to the courts and maybe a small portion to the City. Mayor will verify this. If the City would get some money from fines, it would help pay for police presence. The fine is usually an amount not set by the City. Currently BCS is just issuing warnings.
