Member: CS Made the Motion to approve the Consent Agenda, Member: LA seconded the Motion, All-Yes.

• **Water Issues**

- (\*) Water Master Report- Member LA said the water smells weird. Mayor had spoken to George Simpson, he said he had planned on looking into that and fixing it.
- (\*) DEQ grant information for 2024-The Mayor will get with Mr. Miller and see what we can do about applying for this grant. The deadline is 1-13-2023. Mayor will get Mr. Miller's opinion on whether this would be a good plan to look at. We could start the process and complete it next year. It's a long process. Possibly look at getting \$250,000-\$300,000. Member SM suggested if we can obtain a grant, it would be a good idea to drill a second well. We would need to extend the city's water lines and we could acquire more people to our water system. Get a redundant well and go from there.

• **New Business**

- (\*) Speed Limit Monitoring-Update on grant funding – City planner, Mr. Miller said trying to get a grant for the speed limit signs is not worth our time. It would be more cost effective to just purchase them ourselves. We will need to purchase two signs. The information that the computer system in them would gather would help determine if and when police presence here would help with speeders as well. BCS still has not had time to speak with the Mayor. Mayor was told to get ahold of Clay Tucker and speak with him. It will take approximately 6-8 weeks to get the speed limit signs here. If we were to get the poles they could be installed and set by the time the signs arrived. Scott Leslie or Member McAninch have an auger and could dig the holes. Steve Raddigan will call

the company and get a solid bid. Mayor asked for a Motion to go ahead and order the signs using funds from the LOT account. Member: SM Made the Motion to purchase two solar speed limit signs from the LOT account. Member: CS Second the Motion. Roll call: SM-Y, CS-Y, LA-Y, all approved.

- **Old Business**

- (\*) Mayor's Walkathon update-The Mayor came in first place in the Walkathon!! He will receive a check for \$1000 which he would like to purchase a ball carriage for the Middle and High schoolers. He walked hundreds and thousands of miles to win!
- (\*) Impact Advisory Fee Committee update-The ball is in the GVFD court. They will need to appoint someone to the committee. There is nothing for the City to do. SR will contact them tomorrow. No need to have this on the Agenda.
